We study to show ourselves approved, as those who correctly handle the Word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15).

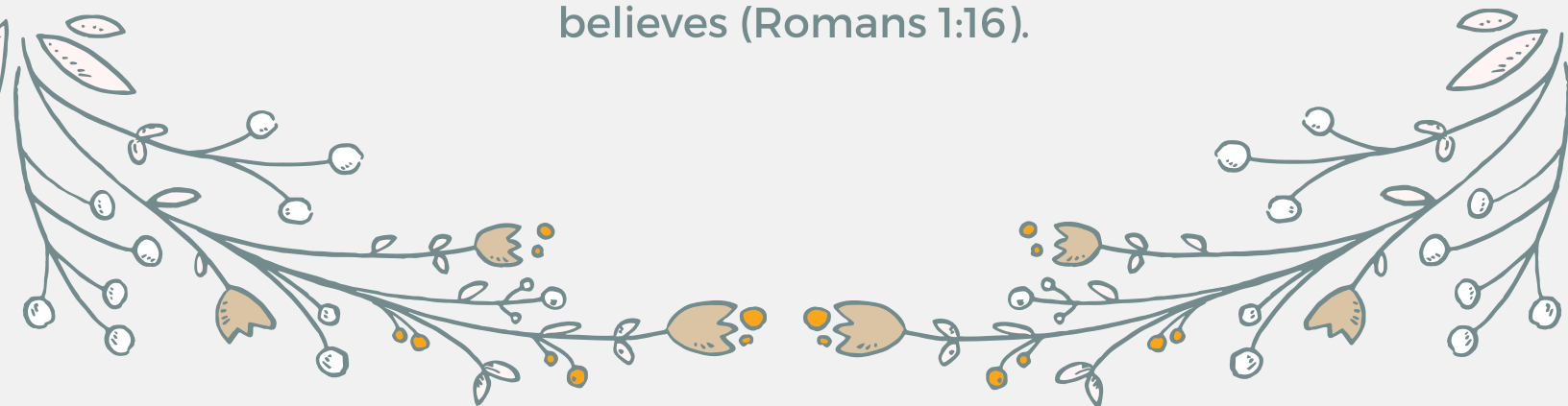
